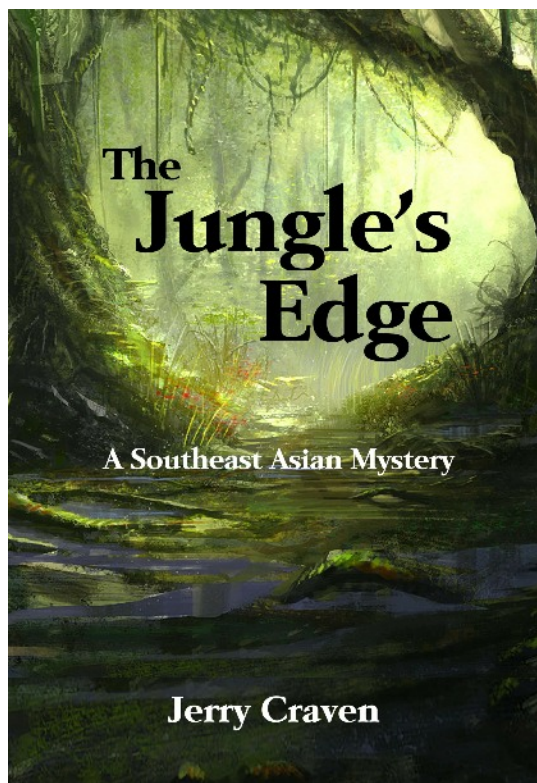


Press Release
